Bayer Marketing Safe Substitute for Morphine

Pharmaceutical company Bayer is now marketing a non-addictive substitute for morphine. They have now trademarked the name Heroin. Bayer's director of pharmacology did not want the drug to have "too complicated a name" so Bayer settled on Heroisch, the German name for heroic. Generally, heroin is marketed as a cough suppressant and over-the-counter treatment for other common ailments, including pneumonia and tuberculosis. Bayer scientists were not the first to make heroin, but the company has led the way in commercializing it. As medical science marches onward into the 20th century we can all be grateful. A FEW THINGS FROM THE SUNDAY EDITOR ABOUT BLOOMERS

The New York Herald

June 2, 1895

Bloomers are the overgrown members of the knickerbocker family. Some men cannot tell bloomers from knickerbockers but a woman can and that's the advantage of being a woman. Some people think bloomers were made to wear to church, but they weren't; they are too loud and disturb the service. The society girl wears bloomers so she can play leap-frog just like her brother, the milkmaid wears them so that she may milk with both hands and hold the pail at the same time.

Bloomers are a species of trousers badly swollen at the knees, very baggy at the pistil pocket and considerably out of shape when you strike a match. When I was a child, I had to wear father's old pants; nowadays children wear out their mother's old bloomers.

Bloomers have many advantages. You don't have to hold them up at street crossings and they are tied around the ankles or knees to keep the mice out. They are cut décolleté at the south end and have buttons up the west side. You can't put them on over your head like a skirt nor round you like a corset, but you have to wriggle into them one leg at a time.

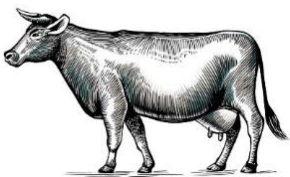

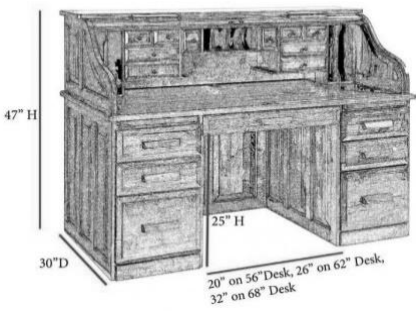

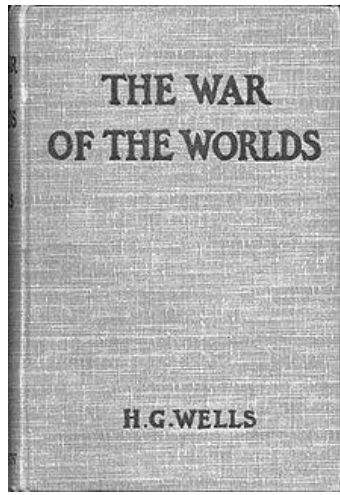

The War of the Worlds is a science fiction novel by English author H. G. Wells first serialized in 1897 in England by *Pearson's Magazine* and in the US by *Cosmopolitan* magazine. This is the novel's first appearance in hardcover. It is a story that details a conflict between mankind and an extraterrestrial race. The novel is the first-person narrative of both an unnamed protagonist in Surrey and of his younger brother in London as southern England is invaded by Martians. The first book details the coming of the Martians and the second book tells how the Earthlings try to survive under the Martians. The book is classified as a scientific romance, like Wells' earlier novel *The Time Machine*, and promises to be just as popular.

Victorian Values Still Dominate in Smalltown America

Victorian values have dominated American social life for much of the 19th century. The notion of separate spheres of life for men and women was commonplace. The male sphere included wage work and politics, while the female sphere involved childrearing and domestic work.

Industrialization and urbanization have brought new challenges to Victorian values. Men have grown weary of toiling tireless hours and seem to be yearning for the blossoming leisure opportunities of the age. Women are becoming more educated, but upon graduation find themselves shut out of many professions. As the century draws to a close, a revolt is indeed brewing as we have witnessed here in the village.

At the vanguard of this revolt are the young, single, middle-class women who work primarily in the cities. Attitudes toward sex are loosening in private, yet few are brave enough to discuss the changes publicly. One exception is Victoria Woodhull. In 1871, she declared the right to love the person of her choice as inalienable. Indeed, she professed the right to free love. She and her sister, Tennessee Claflin published their beliefs in the periodical *WOODHULL AND CLAFLIN'S WEEKLY*. A devout feminist, Woodhull protested the male hold on politics by running for President in 1872.

She became the first female American to do so even though women do not even enjoy the right to vote.

As energetic as the rebellion may be, the reaction has been equally as forceful. Criticizing the evils of modern urban life — prostitution, gambling, promiscuity, and alcohol — Victorians have fought to maintain the values they hold dear.

America is evolving, and no one can bottle up that change. The public struggle between the Victorians and the Progressives merely illustrates the underlying tensions between old and new values. Just as America is struggling with issues like the new role of women in society and politics, so must our village. We must not embrace change for the sake of change, but make slow and careful reforms that preserve the good American values of the past, while keeping an open mind to America's evolution and progression into the 20th century.
